REMINDER:

Felt-Sole Waders Banned beginning March 1, 2012 In Missouri Trout Parks & Designated Waters

The Missouri Conservation Commission has approved a regulation change banning the use of porous-soled waders or footwear incorporating or having attached a porous sole of felted, matted, or woven fibrous material when fishing in trout parks and other specific trout waters. Pending public comment through the Secretary of State's office, the new regulation will go into effect March 1, 2012, the opening day of catch-and-keep fishing at Missouri's four trout parks.

ROCKBRIDGE WINTER OUTING

It turns out eight HOAFF members and a member's guest had enough of

the winter doldrums and suffering from cabin fever to cast caution aside at the end of January to go trout fishing. In years past old man winter had reared its ugly head during this outing but this year proved to be entirely different. It may have dipped below freezing somtime in the middle of the night but daytime temperatures reached into the 40's and 50's. We found that the area had received a sizeable rain earlier in the week so the stream was running pretty high but the good news was it had cleared up considerably and the water level was falling.

Though it did not seem there were as many trout throughout the entire stream this year the ones you could spot were usually good size. Rockbridge doesn't stock the stream as heavily in the winter because there are just not the numbers of fisherman there to catch them.

The mill pond always holds a lot of trout. Water was coming over the dam with a roar and the mist played tricks with the morning light. Heavy flies or split shot was needed to get down to the trout but once there they didn't seem to be too picky. Yellow, red and white seemed to work the best but all shapes and sizes of flies seemed to work. The

trout averaged 15 – 18 inches, jumped, bulldogged, pulled drag and just generally played havoc with your tippet. Yes these are stockers and I am sure that generates an image in your mind but believe me they fight as hard or harder than any native trout I have ever caught.

I cannot speak for everyone but do know Don Murrell, David Howard and Wayne London all caught at least one fish over 20 inches. Don claimed his fish made a run that took him into his backing. Wayne caught his on a caddis dry fly and David's fish weighed over 3 pounds. Hopefully there is a picture or two of those monsters somewhere close to this article.

We found that Rockbridge had also suffered some high water damage last year. A lot of gravel was washed into the stream but efforts were underway to remove a lot of it, while at the same time making some areas of the stream even better. Meals were as good as ever but you need to be carefull ordering the Cake and Eggs breakfast. Wayne London and Ken Schubert can explain.

We didn't have the stream all to ourselves this year. The lack of cold weather didn't help keep everyone away. Don't get me wrong it sure wasn't














crowded. The fishing was as good as ever, maybe even better. Good fishing and good friends, always a great way to start the new year.







This year we are going back to Trout Hollow Lodge on Lake Taneycomo, (800-328-1246 or www.trouthollow.com).

We have reserved space for 16 people on a *first come*, *first served* basis. The accommodations are four units, each with one bath and two bedrooms (two twin beds per room). Each unit has a full kitchen and a living area.

The outing begins on Friday night with dinner on your own. An Italian Restaurant just across the street has been recommended and for anyone more adventurous Branson is just across the river. Saturday morning breakfasts, then we're off for a day of fishing. Lunch is on your own. We will finish the day with a cook out, hosted by the club. natural world.


