The Underwater World of Trout: Discovery and Feeding Lies Presented by instructor, narrator, producer etc.: Wendell 'Ozzie' Ozefovich

Two of the best trout educational videos I have ever seen.

Several years ago, a friend of mine was telling me about a video seminar he saw at a local Trout Unlimited meeting given by a man from New Jersey who liked to film trout in the water. "Unbelievable", he said. "The underwater shots are amazing.". As the years went by, I heard this sentiment from more and more people who were lucky enough to see these presentations, all given with the same "you really gotta see" emotion. Well - I really wanted to see them - but I'm not a member of any clubs where this man would be presenting.

That man from New Jersey is named Wendell "Ozzie" Ozefovich, and he has become somewhat of a legend among those who have seen or heard about his video presentations. Lucky for the rest of us - he has made these seminars available on DVD. I gotta say - it was a long wait for me - but it was well worth it. The buildup was justified.

The second DVD - "Feeding Lies" - is a master course on how trout survive

in the water. What the eat how they move - how they position themselves - and what we can learn from how they "rise" and "take". There is some simply amazing camera work here. There's one spot where the camera is just barely above the surface of a shallow riffle and you can see a trout's head breaking through as it is rising to take spinners, then the camera slowly dips below the water and you see the whole fish and how it is working in the currents, rising with just a shift in fin position. Even cooler about that scene is the camera just below the surface, you can see the spinners coming toward the camera, just as a fish would see them! A trico spinner is a tiny bug - but they look like big black blobs on the surface of that stream - easily detectible.

Jeff led Team USA to its first ever top-ten finish in the World Flyfishing Championships in Jaca, Spain. During the competition Jeff managed to fool fish on every venue and placed third in the individual standings, becoming the only American ever to take home a medal in the twenty-eight year history of the Championships.

Jeff lectures throughout the United States and Canada on nearly every aspect of fly fishing. He demonstrates fly casting, teaches seminars on the basics to the advanced skills of fly fishing and presents many fly fishing destination programs ranging from his home waters to the most remote corners of the globe. Some of his shows take you to destinations you've never heard of and will leave you in awe that such creatures can be enticed to eat a fly!





SEVEN STEPS TO SUCCESSFUL FLY TYING

Take it one step at a time like me. I tried to do fly fishing on the cheap. I love the sport but, due to the nature of military service (ya think I was in it for the money?) I couldn't afford all those nice things off the bat. So, I've been slowly building up (read terminal gear collector after many years).

Tying flies. I decided to learn to tie flies 'cause it had to be cheaper than buying those little bitty things. If you get the urge to tie flies to save yourself some money, here is my foolproof "Seven Step Plan" to tying flies:
